Attractive Airline and Hotel Rates Offer Travelers Savings

HONOLULU – Savvy travelers planning a spring visit to [Hawai'i](#) early will find great deals on airfare and hotel accommodations, in addition to an exciting calendar of world-class events to keep them happy during their vacation on the six main Hawaiian Islands – **Kaua'i, O'ahu, Lāna'i, Moloka'i, Maui, and Hawai'i's Big Island.**

Spring is the season for savings when visiting Hawai'i. In addition to the islands' balmy weather, tranquil beaches, and a diversity of activities to experience, there are also numerous specials being offered to make a Hawai'i visit a tempting proposition.

"Spring is arguably one of the best times to visit Hawai'i and it's not just because of the 80-degree weather," said **John Monahan**, president and CEO of the [Hawai'i Visitors and Convention Bureau \(HVCB\)](#). "Visitors will find exceptional values on airfare and at hotels and resorts across the state, fewer crowds, and a variety of unique festivals to enjoy."

While peak season (summer and winter) roundtrip airfares to Hawai'i can range from \$600 to \$1,500 per person, **travelers can get to Hawai'i for about half the price between February and May on most major carriers serving the islands.** A search on travel website [Kayak.com](#) shows airfare starting as low as \$360 from the west coast and \$640 from the east coast during these months.

Spring values at Hawai'i's hotels and resorts provide travelers with lower nightly rates and better availability than during peak travel periods. **Historically, daily rates drop an average of \$15 to \$20 per night during the spring** offering significant savings which can then be used to enjoy more activities, attractions, restaurants, and get more shopping done while on vacation.

Hawai'i also offers a diverse [calendar of events](#) (see release titled "*Hawai'i's 'Don't Miss' Spring Festivals*") in the spring, highlighted by festivals celebrating the unique arts, culture, and cuisine of the Islands.
